#### Emergency and First Aid

##### Procedures:

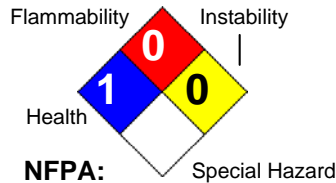
